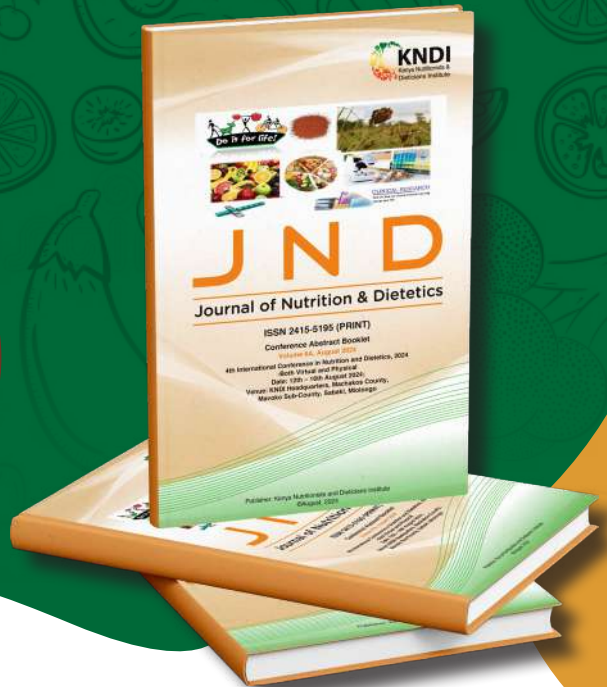


JOURNAL OF NUTRITION AND DIETETICS (JND)

The Journal of Nutrition and Dietetics (JND), Nairobi, is a peer-reviewed international Journal dedicated to advancing knowledge across all sub-disciplines of Nutrition and Dietetics. JND, however, publishes biannually and serves as a platform for Researchers, Scholars, Practitioners, Policy makers, and Educators to disseminate high-quality research and innovative insights pertinent to the fields.

Authors are required to pay a USD 50 manuscript processing fee upon manuscript acceptance.
